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Located in the heart of La Mancha (see map on page 4), the Piños Altos estate is truly a wonder to behold – _____ acres of rich, rolling grassland, majestic oak trees and clear, rippling streams. The skies above Piños Altos are regularly graced by our resident eagles, hawks and falcons – a soaring testament to the Saiz family’s centuries-old dedication to wildlife husbandry and conservation.

The Saiz home itself – a charming 16th century hacienda of brick and stucco -- spans 2,000 square meters, with a lovingly-maintained garden and four comfortable patios from which to take in the surrounding countryside. Our 14 guestrooms are all luxuriously appointed

with traditional Spanish decor and their own private baths. The Great Room at the center of the home features an awe-inspiring collection of trophies from around the world, and makes the perfect place to relax after the day’s hunt, trading tales of the day’s adventures over a glass of fine Spanish wine.

Yet another facet of the Piños Altos experience is the delicious, homemade cuisine. Our staff prepares each meal with meticulous care, including traditional Spanish delicacies such as tapas, paella and a host of unique wild game dishes. Our wine cellar boasts some of the finest vintages from both Spain and around the world, and every delectable dessert is made by hand.

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Spain has been called the finest trophy-hunting destination in all of Europe, and with very good reason. Our teeming populations of indigenous species include seven species exclusive to Spain -- four species of Spanish ibex, two species of chamois and the legendary giant – the Spanish Red deer. Spain is also home to tremendous numbers of European Fallow and Roe deer, Barbary sheep, European wild boar and Mouflon, making the serious big game hunter's choices both large and plentiful.

A typical day of hunting in the Piños Altos territory starts with a light breakfast, then a short drive to our nearby hunting grounds. There, you and your guide will find healthy numbers of trophy Spanish Red, Roe and Fallow deer, Mouflon and European boar. When the animals bed down in the late morning, you'll return to Pinos Altos for a full breakfast, then spend a relaxing afternoon taking in the area's spectacular sightseeing and shopping. Later in the day, it's back to the field to stalk the trophy of your dreams. At sundown, you'll return to our hacienda once again for cocktails, dinner and friendly conversation before retiring to your quarters for the evening.

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
